LUIS I Felipe, príncipe de Asturias, rey de España

Madrid 25.VIII.1707–31.VIII.1724
The son of Philippe V of Spain and his first wife, Marie-Louise de Sardaigne, Louis, prince des Asturies was made a knight of both the Saint-Esprit and the Toison d'or in 1717. He succeeded as king of Spain in 1724 when his father abdicated in his favour, but died seven months later (when his father resumed the throne). No doubt under the influence of his step-mother, the amateur pastellist Isabella Farnese, the prince produced two allegorical pastels in 1721 (the same year in which the Queen made a pastel of the king now at La Granja).

Among numerous portraits one by Vialy (1718), known only from engravings, may have been in pastel.
