### **LANEUVILLE, Jean-Louis Titon, dit**

Paris 26.XII.1756–26.III.1826

Painter, art dealer and expert. He was the illegitimate son of a conseiller at the parlement de Paris, and became a pupil of David (enrolled in the école de l'Académie royale in 1778, under Pajou, aged 20), whose works are confused with his and with Ducreux's; his portraits of Revolutionaries have an iconographic value. The evidence that he used pastel is slender – a single record from a nineteenth century exhibition; his posthumous sale (Paris, 5–7.VI.1826) did not include any.
