LAWRENCE, George

Dublin c.1758 – p.1807

Also Laurence. His two brothers John and Robert were miniaturists. He was a pupil of F. R. West and James Mannin at the Dublin Society school, and exhibited at the Irish Society of Artists from 1771. From 15 Exchange Street (to 1781) and then 34 Grafton Street, he advertised his likenesses "in Crayons, and in Miniature at one guinea each. The same size of the crayons, in oil at one guinea and a half"; later his prices rose to two guineas. In *Saunders's news-letter*, 28.VII.1781, a typical notice appeared:

STRIKING LIKENESSES ENGAGED

In Crayons and in Miniature, finished in the best
Manner, at one Guinea each, by

GEORGE LAWRENCE,

At his Lodgings, No. 34, Grafton-street, near Annstreet, where Specimens of his Work may be seen.

Both the unknown subjects sold in 2002 and 2005 are inscribed with the artist's later address, 35 Frederick Street, Dublin. The pastellist's brother Robert was recorded as a miniature painter at 35 Frederick Street in the Wilson's Dublin directories of 1798, 1804 and 1820; this, together with the lease description of George's profession (v. infra), suggest he remained an amateur artist.

Documents in the Irish Registry of Deeds indicate a George Lawrence, gentleman and cabinet maker of Grafton Street, who leased his property in Grafton Street for 100 years from 1.X.1784 (memorial 309134), and assigned property in Frederick Street to George Lawrence, Junior, described as a scrivener and evidently the artist. George Lawrence, cabinet-maker of Ballybough-bridge, died in 1810 leaving a will (not seen). A George Lawrence of Peter Street was buried at St Nicholas Without, Dublin, on 27.IV.1820 but there is nothing to exclude this being a homonym.

There are several miniatures in the National Gallery of Ireland. He exhibited portraits in oil from 1801. An oil portrait, signed and dated Dublin 1807, indicates that the 1802 date of his death reported in most sources is incorrect.

The technique reflects Lawrence's training: the pastel is applied thinly and modelling is achieved by extensive use of visible black chalk lines in a manner found on early Hamilton portraits. There is however a distinctive spontaneity in the expressions.
