Initially a pupil of Daniel Hien, he worked under Casanova in Paris before being adopted by Christian IV. in Mannheim. From 1777 he was associated with Girardin and Rousseau at Ermenonville. He produced portraits, landscapes, pastoral and hunting pictures painted in oil or engraved. A pastel said to be of Meyer (*v*. Éc. fr.) may possibly be by him.
