MERCIER, Philippe

Berlin 1689 – London 18.VII.1760

Portraitist in oils; he exhibited "a stained drawing", a view of Richmond Bridge, at the Royal Academy in 1779. The painter's work has been confused with that of Claude Mercier (q.r.), and it does not seem that he made any pastels. His widow Dorothy, née Clapham (they were married in 1735), a miniaturist and watercolourist, continued to sell artists' materials from Windmill Street after his death (trade card, V&A) until her retirement in 1768; she appears to have died in 1782.
