MIGNARD, Nicolas, dit Mignard d'Avignon

Troyes bpt 7.II.1606 – Paris 20.III.1668
Reçu 1663; recteur-adjoint 1664. Brother of Pierre Mignard. He was active in Fontainebleau; Rome, 1635–37; Avignon 1637–60, and Paris, after 1660, and produced history, mythological, religious and still life paintings as well as portraits. It is difficult to assess the attributions of two quite different figurative pastels which have not been seen, and from the photographs of which it is difficult to tell whether the artist was left-handed (as Nicolas Mignard was). The landscape drawing in the Louvre, in trois crayons with touches of pastel, is more typical.
