MORLAND, George

London 1763–1804

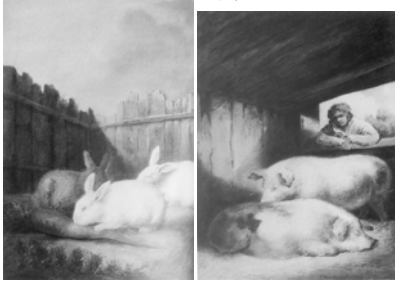
Son of Henry Robert Morland (*q.v.*). The well-known landscape and genre painter exhibited some “sketches” at the Royal Academy at the age of 10. According to his early biographer George Dawe, these were “chalk drawings tinted with crayon, which possessed considerable merit”. Two farmyard scenes are much later and rather unusual in this medium, although he made numerous drawings with animals using various media including coloured chalks.
