MOUCHET, François-Nicolas

Gray 10.II.1749–10.II.1814

The pupil of François Devosge and Greuze, he won first prize at the Académie royale in 1776. In 1780 he married, in Paris, Jeanne-Élisabeth Guyon. His head, apparently of an artist, shown at the 1782 Salon de la Correspondance, was said to have been made with “beaucoup de liberté; on y remarque une vigueur mâle”. In 1786 he applied to the crown for financial assistance, which was refused. Subsequently he became a magistrate, and was sent to Belgium in 1792 to select art works for seizure. During his imprisonment the following year, he made a number of portraits. He seems to have worked more as a miniaturist than a pastellist; there are also genre paintings. On 1.XII.1813 in Champtonnay he married a second time, to a Françoise Lambert; he died two months later.
