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MARINI, Leonardo

?Piemonte c.1730 – c.1807

Painter of still lifes, battle and theatrical scenes and illustrations in various media, including oil, drawings in pen and ink and at least one pastel. He was active in Turin between 1773 and 1798. In 1777 he was costumista at the Reale Teatro, Turin, and introduced costumes which mixed rococo fantasy with Chinese imperial exoticism; a number of watercolour drawings for these have appeared on the market. His only known pastel evokes the Dutch Golden age rather more freely than the precise work of the Lyon school artists such as Berjon (*q.v.*).
