MIDDLETON, Lady, née Margaret Gambier

London 21.VIII.1730 - Teston 10.X.1792 Daughter of a barrister, James Gambier, who was director of the French Hospital, warden of the Fleet Prison and governor of St Thomas's Hospital; she was baptised at St Giles-in-the-Fields. In 1761 she married Sir Charles Middleton, RN, later First Lord of the Admiralty, created Lord Barham in 1805 after her death. Their daughter Diana (1762-1823) married Sir Gerard Noel Noel and was created Baroness Barham suo jure. "The credit of individuality will not be denied of Lady Middleton"; she numbered Sir Joshua Reynolds, Dr Johnson and William Wilberforce among her acquaintance, and she played a role in the abolition of slavery. In a letter probably of 10.IX.1788 Hannah More wrote to thank her for the offer of a portrait of either "the Archbishop or the Moralist", but encouraging her instead to portray a living sitter - Sir Charles, Elizabeth Bouverie or Lady Middleton herself. Some of her oil portraits of members of the family of the Earls of Gainsborough are at Exton Park. There is a miniature of her by Jeremiah Meyer in the NPG (NPG 7043).
