Klein-Oldendorf 17.II.1759 – Lauenau 16.XII.1836

The Herr von Münchhausen apparently responsible for three rather good pastels found in the family castle is not the celebrated storyteller or "Lügebaron" Karl Friedrich Hieronymus Freiherr von Münchhausen (1720–1797), but most likely a member of a different branch of the family. Karl von Münchhausen was an officer in the army of the Landgraf von Hessen-Kassel and also a writer and it seems amateur artist. During his service in the American war he became a friend of Johann Gottfried Seume. In 1792/93 he served in France and was promoted to lieutenant-colonel. In 1801 he marreid Marianne von Schenk.
