MUNN, James

England 1738 – Blackheath brd 30.VII.1818 James Munn is said to be a carriage-painter, and he exhibited landscapes, portraits and still lifes in oil, ink and plumbago at the Society of Artists and the Free Society between 1767 and 1774. He was a friend of Paul Sandby and he called his son Paul Sandby Munn (1773-1845), watercolourist and engraver (PS as godfather). His wife was a Charlotte Mills; they were married at St Giles-inthe-Fields, London on 4.I.1771. He died in 1818, leaving a will made in Dartmouth Row, Blackheath; he died there aged 80 and was buried in St Alphege's Greenwich. Pastels
