NAIGEON, Jean-Claude

Dijon 9/12.XII.1753–11.I.1832

Jean-Claude was the son of Philibert Naigeon and Anne Valot of Dijon. He was a pupil of Devosge at the École de dessin de Dijon; he exhibited portraits, history, mythological and religious pastels and paintings from 1771 to 1777. Claude Hoin (q.v.) was a witness to his marriage to Louise-Catherine Blanchot, veuve Hossart in Paris, Saint-Sulpice on 8.VI.1787. He then studied with David, and travelled to Rome before returning to Dijon to succeed Devosge as professeur de dessin at the école de Dijon in 1812. He was made a chevalier de la Légion d'honneur and conservateur du musée du Luxembourg. Naigeon served on the Commission des arts from its foundation in 1793, and was a friend and heir of Charles-Paul-Jérôme Bréa (q.v.).

In his own collection was a pastel by La Tour, of Mlle Clairon. Like most of Devosge's students he produced pastels at Dijon, but they were not a major part of his output. The basis for the attribution for the 2001 sale is unclear.

Jean-Claude's son Jean-Guillaume-Elzidor Naigeon (1797–1867) was also a painter, and succeeded him as conservateur du musée de Luxembourg in 1732.

There are numerous confusions with the history painter Jean Naigeon (Beaune 1.IV.1757 – Paris 22.VI.1832) who married Marie-Anne Faisneux in Paris, 15.V.1796. Jean-Claude is also incorrectly described as the brother of Diderot's friend and editor Jacques-André Naigeon (1735–1810), cousin of the history painter. The register of élèves at the École de l'Académie royale list a "Jean B... Naigon, peintre, de Dijon, agé de 19 ans" in 1775, protegé par Doyen, and a pupil of Bronck.
