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NØRAGGER, Christoffer Nicolaj Nobel von

Odense 1751 – Sandholt 14.V.1807 The son of Kancelliraad Christian Nøragger (also spelt Norrager, Nørager etc.) and Martha Nobel, he was a Danish officer, first commissioned in 1772, and promoted to lieutenant-colonel in the Fynske Landeværnsregiment in 1804. In 1787 he was married, in Copenhagen, to Christine Caroline Wilhelmine Rønne (1757-1818); they had at least four children. A pair of pastels of the couple, sold as school of Jens Juel (v. Danish sch.), may possibly be by Nøragger himself, as he was also an amateur portraitist in oil, miniature and pastel, and a pupil of Juel (q.v.). Some of his miniatures of the royal family are in Frederiksborg. He painted all the kings of the house of Oldenburg on a sheet of parchment which he sent to Catherine II. He also made copies after Rembrandt and Van Dyck.
