fl. Turin 1790–1837

Along with Sofia Giordano and Giuseppina Borghese (*qq.n.*), one of the female pastellists active in Turin at the turn of the century. The daughter of the secretary of the Accademia reale delle scienze di Torino and director of the post from 1793, she was a pupil of Pécheux, and was first recorded as a *consorella* of the Compagnia di San Luca in Turin in 1790. When in 1795 Borghese sought admission, Teresa Boccardi declared “d'accettare d'esservi iscritta dopo di Madama Borghese.” Her husband was Giuseppe Antonio Nuytz, cavaliere gran croce, presidente capo, e secondo presidente del Regio Senato di Piemonte, of Dutch origins. The only works known are those exhibited in Turin in 1820; their dates are unknown.


