NAUDET, Thomas-Charles

Paris 1773–14.VII.1810

The son of a print-seller, he enrolled as an élève in the école de l'Académie royale in Paris on 10.X.1789, aged 15½ and was trained as a landscape artist by Hubert Robert. He specialised in drawings in gouache, pen and ink etc. of ceremonial scenes. He also made some 40 engravings. Ingres drew his portrait in Rome in 1806; it was engraved by the subject's sister, Caroline (1775–1839). He died in Paris, 9 rue du Jardin.
