PAILLOT DE MONTABERT, Jacques-Nicolas

Troyes 6.XII.1771 – Saint-Martin-ès-Vignes 6.V.1849

Painter; pupil of Baudemant (q.v.) in his native Troyes. He emigrated during the Revolution, returning c.1800 when he entered the École des beaux-arts under Suvée and later David. His known work is almost entirely nineteenth century and in oil or encaustic (such as the Nymphe et faune, 1808, in the mBA, Troyes). He left some theoretical writings in manuscript. The two pastels of his aunt and her husband are probably c.1800 or later.
