PARKINSON, Thomas

Oxford 10.XII.1744 – c.1789

Portraitist in oil and pastel. He was admitted to the Royal Academy Schools on 30.XI.1772 (“aged 27 last Dec 10th”). He exhibited at the Free Society (1769–70), the Society of Artists (1772–73) and the Royal Academy (1774–89), from various addresses, including Mr Stacy’s, colourman, corner of Long Acre.
