The ophtalmologue may be an early work of Petit de Villeneuve (*q.n.*); the signature seems to be formed in the same way as later examples, although the technique of the work is significantly different. It could perhaps be by one of his brothers or another homonym. Petit de Villeneuve was related to the Troyes surgeon Paupe known for his cataract operations, using a technique developed by the oculist Jean-Louis Petit (portrayed by Louis Vigée; he is not the subject of this pastel).
