PICKARD, Mrs Thomas, née Harriet Woodley

1766 - Bath 29.V.1844

Daughter of William Woodley (1728–1793), MP, governor of the Leeward Islands and his wife, née Ann Payne, Harriet (also Hariot, Harriett) Woodley married Thomas Pickard (1755–1830) of Bloxworth House, Dorset, at St George's, Hanover Square in 1788. Her sister Frances (1760–1823) married Henry Bankes of Kingston Lacy. Both girls are shown with their parents in a group portrait by Zoffany now at Kingston Lacy. Harriet was an amateur pastellist. The half dozen copies after Hoare, Greuze and Reynolds at Kingston Lacy may have been executed in the nineteenth century. Mrs Pickard also seems to have taught her sister-in-law Anne Bankes (q.n.) to use pastel.
