PIGALLE, Madeleine-Élisabeth

Sens 11.xi.1751 – Saint-Pierre-lès-Nemours

8.III.1827

Known as Madelon. Painter; distant relative of the sculptor Jean-Baptiste Pigalle, whose pupil she is said to have become when he visited her native Sens c.1766 and found her drawings showed taste and ability. She was the daughter of Gervais-Protails Pigalle (1724–1802), marchand de bois à Sens pour la provision de Paris. She exhibited an oil painting at the Salon de la Correspondance in 1782, from rue des Bourdonnais. Her pastel tête de femme from 1785 was described as “un peu gris” but “bien senti & bien détaché de son fonds. La tête est saillante.”
