PITTONI, Giovanni Battista

Venice 6.VI.1687-6.XI.1767

Painter, engraver and draughtsman of religious, mythological and history pictures; pupil of his uncle Francesco Pittoni. He became a member of the guild of painters in Venice in 1716, and later was a founder of the Accademia, becoming president in 1758 in succession to Giambattista Tiepolo. He was also close to Sebastiano Ricci and Piazzetta, and an important figure in the spread of the Venetian rococo to Germany, Poland and Russia. Whether he worked in pastel is not clear.
