PRÉVOST l'aîné, Jean-Jacques

Nointel 1.VII.1736 – Paris c.1782

Flower painter and miniaturist who exhibited one portrait, that of Boucher, shown at the Salon de Saint-Luc in 1774 together with still lifes. Most of his work is in oil, with a few gouaches known. The 1768 pendants are the only known surviving example in pastel (they have not been directly examined), although the pair on the Blondel sale may well have been accurately described (by Rémy). His wife was a miniaturist, while two younger brothers, Guillaume Prévost (1736–1788) and Jean-Louis Prévost (1745–p.1810), also born in Nointel, were also a flower painters, the latter a pupil of Bachelier. His son Jean-Louis-Robert Prévost (1767–1788) and brother Guillaume died on the La Pérouse expedition which they was illustrating.
