QUANTEN, Carl Jacob von

Finland 1734 – ?Kvantenburg, Västra Götaland 1789

A group of four pastels, signed on the backing "de Quanten à Brunswick", appeared in 2010, catalogued as by Quantin or Quentin (other variants are Quant, Quandt). One of these relates to a pastel at Bayreuth attributed to Hagelgans, while that of Prinz Ferdinand uses a widely repeated image; given the range of expressions, it is likely that the remaining two also derive from other sources. The aritst is evidently the figure encountered on 17.VIII.1764 by James Boswell on his visit to Braunschweig: Quantin a Suede an officer in the service of

Brunswic was kind enough to entertain me with some music this morning. He plays delightfully on the German flute, & composes very well in a singular taste, with quick transitions from high to low notes very hard to play. He paints too. He is a lively genteel brisk young man. He brought to my mind many ideas of healthy, accomplished foreign Officers.

A Swedish nobleman, he entered the French service as a cornet in the régiment royal polonais in 1756, becoming a lieutenant in 1760. From 1763 he was in the Braunschweig garde de corps, returning to the French service in 1771, where he attained the rank of colonel and was awarded the Mérite militaire. He played the violin as well as the flute, and was a founder member of the Kungliga Musikaliska Akademie in Stockholm in 1771. The chevalier von Quanten composed a set of Six Solos pour Flûte, Op. 1, published by Johann Julius Hummel in Amsterdam in 1769. In 1773 he published Tankar j krigs-wetenskapen, a military treatise. He retired to his estate Quanteborg in Dalsland in 1778. The following year he married Charlotta von Scheiding (1758-1835); their son Carl Gustaf (1788-1842) was commandant of Nya Elfsborg.
