RESTOUT, Jean-Bernard

Paris 22.II.1732-18.VII.1797

Son of Jean Restout (q.v.) and Marie-Anne Hallé, he was awarded the prix de Rome in 1758 and studied there between 1761 and 1765. He was agréé 1765, reçu 1769, professeur 1771, and seemed destined for a successful official career as a history painter until he refused to submit his works to the Salon jury and was required to resign from the Académie. His subsequent output was very small. The signed autoportrait was done while he was imprisoned at Saint Lazare during the Revolution; no doubt the absence of materials caused him to work in an unfamiliar medium. The relationship with an unsigned version is curious: even the lady shown on the snuff-box is different (Restout never married).

La Tour mentioned him with two other pastellists in his first testament of 20.X.1768 (ten months after the death of his father, La Tour's close friend): "Mrs Restout, Montjoye, Ensiaume partageront mes crayons de pastels et couleurs et toutes mes études qui ne seront pas sous verre ou glace et qui ne sont pas collez sur des cartons ou des toiles". Moreover one of his early biographers (François Regnault, MS, Willk-Brocard 2017, p. 188) mentioned that after having learned with his father, he had also "pour maître Latour, célèbre peintre de portrait. Cet artiste sut voir dans les précoces dispositions de son élève les talens futurs de [Jean-Bernard] Restout."

Willk-Brocard finds influences of La Tour in several of his works (among them a female portrait, 95 P, inspired by Mme Masse), and lists a portrait of his master (61 D) inferred from what appears to be a confused report of a Moitte engraving.
