### fl. London 1771–72

Italian artist; worked in London and was influenced by Cipriani. He exhibited crayon portraits at the Royal Academy in 1771 and 1772 from an address near St James's Church, Piccadilly (that of Peter Darlot, a wine merchant). A notice in the *Daily advertise*, 21.III.1774, announced the auction at Langfords "Thursday next" [24.III.1774; not in Lugt] of "some capital Drawings in crayons, by Mr Rocca."
