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SAINT-OURS, Jean-Pierre

Geneva 4.IV.1752-6.IV.1809

History painter and portraitist; his father, also an artist, sent him to Paris at the age of 16 where he enrolled as an élève at the École de l'Académie royale in 1768, working in Vien's studio. He entered a pastel for the Caylus competition in 1774, but no further examples are known. Saint-Ours received the premier grand prix in 1780. As a Protestant, he was ineligible for the bursary, and so travelled to Rome at his own expense. He returned to Geneva in 1792 and turned largely to portraiture. A number of his works in oil were copied in pastel by his daughter Catherine (1797–1881).
