## **SAINT-OURS, Jean-Pierre**

Geneva 1752–1809

History painter and portraitist; his father, also an artist, sent him to Paris at the age of 16 where he worked in Vien's studio. He entered a pastel for the Caykus competition in 1774, but no further examples are known. Saint-Ours received the premier grand prix in 1780. As a Protestant, he was ineligible for the bursary, and so travelled to Rome at his own expense. He returned to Geneva in 1792 and turned largely to portraiture. The isolated pastel in Geneva may be a later copy by his daughter Catherine (1797–1881) after an oil study of c.1792–1800.
