SCHOPENHAUER, Frau Heinrich Floris, née Johanna Trosiener

Gdańsk 9.VII.1766 – Jena 17.IV.1838

The mother of the philosopher married a rich merchant at the age of 18. In 1806 she moved to Weimar with her children Arthur and Adele, and there became a writer and noted salonnieré surrounded by Goethe, Wieland, Schegel etc. Among her works were articles on painters, including Jan Van Eyck, and she published a biography of her friend Fernow. The pastel of him is likely to have been executed after her move to Weimar, and there is no evidence that she made any pastels before 1800. It seems that she was influenced to take up the medium, and guided in its use, by Johann Heinrich Meyer (*q.v.*); she describes making a pastel self-portrait in a letter to Arthur Schopenhauer of 10.VII.1807

[...] ich habe mein Porträt angefangen in Lebensgröße in Pastell nach dem Spiegel zu mahlen, und Meyer giebt mir Raht dabey, ich wollte doch einmahl wieder etwas Großes mahlen, ich habe Conta und seine Schwester in Miniatur gemahlt und viel Ehre damit eingelegt. Bis 12 Uhr blieb Meyer bey mir, so lange mahlte ich [...]
