Kreypau 12.III.1770 – Dorpat 2.I.1838
Also Karl Gustav Senff or Kārl August Zenfs.
Portraitist, genre and landscape painter, working
in oil, pastel and watercolour; he also made
lithographs and engravings. He studied in
Dresden and Leipzig and in 1802 was appointed
professor of drawing and engraving at the newly
established university at Mitau (Jelgava). He is
said to have been a successful pastel portraitist;
the only known examples are from the
nineteenth century, although they continue in
the eighteenth century tradition taught in
Dresden. He was the brother of the still-life
pastellist Adolf Senff (1785–1863) who studied
theology before turning to painting in 1810.
