Also Seymor, Seymoor, Seymore, Seamor; mentioned by Vertue as a banker of Fleet Street with an extensive knowledge of art and of the nobles and virtuosi of his day. He was steward of the Virtuosi of St Luke in 1702, and in 1711 subscribed to Kneller's academy. He had "an infinite number of curious pictures" and himself "drew and limned very ingeniously." His son "Jimmy" was a painter of racehorses, whose extravagance was said to have led to his father's bankruptcy.
