SPENCER, Countess, née Lavinia Bingham

Castlebar 27.VII.1762 – London 8.VI.1831 Daughter of the illustrator and miniaturist Margaret Smith, Lady Lucan; amateur pastellist, to whom Horace Mann drew Walpole's attention. Her work was engraved by Gilray and Bartolozzi. A pastel of "Miss Bingham" by Bartolozzi (*q.v.*) may be of her. She exhibited at the Free Society in 1783 as Mrs Spencer, a crayon painter, the year following her marriage to the politician and bibliophile George John Spencer (1758–1834), then Viscount Althorp. Countess Spencer, known for her erudition and charm, was hostess at both Spencer House and Althorp to the most prominent politicians and intellectuals of the day.
