STEWARD, Joseph

Upton 6.VII.1753 – Hartford 15.IV.1822
Steward graduated from Dartmouth in 1780 as a clergyman but is said to have taken up portraiture when illness prevented him pursuing his career in Newport in 1786; he may have been taught by Samuel King (1749–1819), whose other pupils included Gilbert Stuart, Washington Allston and Edward Greene Malbone. His work, in oil and pastel, is primitive, and, despite Harlow's thorough researches, it is difficult to dissent from William Dunlap's assessment that "Mr Stewart painted wretched portraits". He established a museum in Hartford.
