STEWART of Killymoon, Mrs William, née Eleanor King

Rockingham 1722 - 1810

Amateur Irish artist. Eleanor or Elinor, daughter of Sir Henry King of Rockingham, MP for County Roscommon and his wife, Isabella Wingfield. The portrait of her husband, Col. William Stewart, together with a pendant man in Roman costume, possibly a member of the family, cannot be by Gardner, and are tentatively reattributed to her. A weaker pastel copy of a Rembrandt self-portrait, possibly nineteenth century, was in the same sale. Her sister-in-law and niece and other members of the Trench family were the subjects of a series of pastels by Hugh Douglas Hamilton (*q.v.*).
