TARÉ, François-Denis

Paris 15.IX.1740–p.1799

Enrolled as a pupil at the Académie royale , aged 23 the previous September, under Dandré-Bardon. He won a silver medal in 1765. His father, a maître tapissier, died when he was 2½. On 10.I.1769 he married Marie-Françoise Michel in Paris, Saint-Roch. A handful of exhibits (in various genres and media, one picture being a male portrait in pastel) at the Salons of 1791, 1793 and 1799, from 18, rue des Poulies or École centrale du Panthéon, is all that we know of this artist. A Detaré exhibited in 1795 from the same street, perhaps the same artist.
