TESSIN, Grevinna, née Ulrika Lovisa Sparre

Stockholm 23.V.1711 – Åkerö 14.XII.1768
The daughter of greve Erik Sparre, formerly Charles XII's ambassador to Louis XIV, Ulla Sparre married the celebrated connoisseur greve Carl Gustaf Tessin (1695–1770) and played a significant role in the success of his embassy to Paris in 1739–42. She particularly impressed the ladies at the French court with her sophistication and culture. As an amateur artist she made some pastel copies after Aved and La Tour under the direction of her teacher, Gustaf Lundberg (*q.v.*), whose portrait of her husband she also copied. There is much confusion concerning the portraits of the princesse de Rohan, a great friend of Ulla Tessin, of which two versions reached Sweden, one of which is supposed to have been made by Ulla Tessin. The quality of the version from Kulla Gunnarstorp makes it unlikely to be anything less than a fully autograph work by Lundberg, and the copy by Mme Tessin is probably the version at Övedskloster.
