THONNESSE, Jean-Baptiste

Dijon 30.IV.1755 – Angers 26.X.1830
Also Tonnesse; Thonesse. Pupil of Devosge at the école de dessin in Dijon (where he won the painting prize in 1770) and of Coustou; history painter, portraitist, miniaturist and draughtsman. He waent to Rome in the 1770s, returning to Paris by 1781 where he married Christine Chrétien in 1786. In 1804 he was recorded in Versailles. In 1809 he was appointed professeur at the Prytanée at La Flèche. He was active in Angers from at least 1815 on. Only a few pastels are recorded, one included among his numerous submissions to the 1771 exhibition; the others much later. His daughter-in-law and pupil Fanni Ferrey exhibited at the salons of 1793 and 1796.
