## TISCHBEIN, Johann Heinrich Wilhelm

Haina 1751 – Eutin 1829

Pupil of his uncle Johann Heinrich d. Ä., he worked with the latter's brother Johann Jacob in Hamburg before going to Kassel in 1773. Four years later he travelled to Dresden and Berlin; subsequently to Rome and Switzerland; and, in 1787, with Goethe (so that he is often referred to as "Goethe Tischbein"), to Naples, where he also encountered Sir William Hamilton. Later he returned to Kassel and from 1808 settled in Eutin.

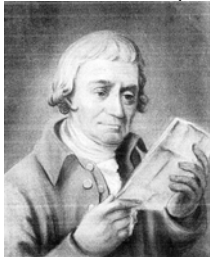
