TREVISANI, Francesco

Koper 9.IV.1656 – Rome 30.VII.1746
Painter of history, religious and mythological works, as well as some portraits. Born in Capodistria, then a Venetian town (now in Slovenia), he was taught by Antonio Zanchi in Venice before he moved to Rome in 1678 where he was taken up by the Chigi and Ottoboni families. It is unclear whether he worked in pastel, or on what basis a few examples have been ascribed to him.
