TROOST, Sara

Amsterdam 1732–17.X.1803

Daughter of Cornelis Troost (g.v.); she married Jakob Ploos van Amstel; her sister Elisabeth was married to his brother, the collector Cornelis Ploos van Amstel (g.v.). She evidently benefitted from her father's glory, as witness the fulsome dedication to her of Antoine-Marin Le Mierre's *La Peinture, poème en trois chants* published in Amsterdam (1770): "héritière du nom & des talents de ce Pere célèbre", referring also to her numerous pupils in miniature and pastel. She also worked in gouache, making copies of a number of her father's pictures in this medium (they are noted under the originals).
