Liverpool c.1763 – Toxteth 6.III.1825 The son and heir of Richard Tate (q,v), and a firm friend of Joseph Wright of Derby (q,v). He sent four items to the 1784 exhibition, including two chalk heads and a moonlight after Wright in addition to the pastel. One of the chalk heads may be the copy of a Wright head, in chalk or possibly grisaille pastel.
