TINELLI, Tiberio

Venice 1586–22.v.1638 History and relgious painter and portraitist; pupil of Leandro Bassano (q.v.). His small portraits were popular in France, where Louis XIII (q.v.) is said to have sent him the order of Saint-Michel to persuade him to come to Paris (the award is not recorded in Colleville & Saint-Christo). The inducement was unsuccessful, although Louis XIII received a pastel of Louis Hesselin, the king's agent in Venice who acquired a number of pictures there and in Rome where he travelled with Sébastien Bourdon. Hesselin was later portrayed by Nanteuil and owned two pastels by Vouet according to his posthumous inventory.
