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VAN LOO, Charles-Amédée-Philippe

Rivoli 25.VIII.1719 – Paris 15.XI.1795
Son and pupil of Jean-Baptiste. History painter; agréé 1746; reçu 1747. It does not appear that he was a pastellist. A portrait of Franklin presumably by Amédée Van Loo and known from the print by Alix has certain similarities to a pastel now considered to be by Ducreux; various pastel copies of the latter have previously been misattributed to Van Loo as a result.
