### WAGNER, Anselm

Timisoara 1766–1806

Son of a Viennese painter, Michael Wagner (1731–1783), who had settled in Transylvania, Anselm studied in Vienna under the Dane Johann Jakob Stunder (1759–1811); he was influenced also by the Baroque style of Meytens, turning (around 1796) to a rococo style, and later to a neo-classical approach. Wagner abandoned religious painting for portraiture in oil, miniature and pastel, and made numerous portraits in Transylvania from the mid-1790s on. From around 1799 Wagner travelled in Sibiu, Brasov, Cluj and Mintia, painting portraits of the noble Gyulay family. His first recorded pastel, dated 1793, was a copy of a French pastel; the subsequent works, some of which have survived, reflect various influences and uneven achievement. His distinctive signature is sometimes followed by a three digit number: this may not be the year from which the first digit is absent, since one of the numbers is 779 and shows a young man in a costume from c.1800.

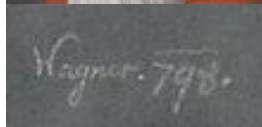
