#### WARD, James

London 23.x.1769 – Cheshunt 16.XI.1859 James Ward started his career as a pupil of J. R. Smith and then studied with his older brother William Ward (qq.n). He exhibited two pastels in 1790 from Warren Place, near Kentish Town. He was later to have a successful career at the Royal Academy (exhibiting from 1792, becoming a full member in 1811) as an animal, genre, history and portrait painter, draughtsman, watercolourist and engraver.
