WYNNE, Mrs Owen, née Dorothy Luttrell

London 1658–1724 Dorothy Luttrell, the sister of the historian Narcissus Luttrell, was the dedicatee of the 1683 manuscript *Epitome of painting* written by her cousin Edward Luttrell (*q.v.*). It appears from it (and from the additions which are in her hand) that she was an amateur artist, and probably tried pastel as well as the other techniques (ranging from oil painting to japanning and other decorative procedures) in the manual. She married, at St Giles's on 18.XII.1688, Owen Wynne (1651–1700), warden of the Mint, under-secretary of state. Her will was made 17.VIII.1713, proved 16.V.1724. A printed invitation to the funeral of “Mrs Dorothy Wynne Widow” at Westminster Abbey, 27.III.1724, is in the collection of the Clark Library at UCLA.
