ZINCKE, Christian Friedrich

Dresden 1685 – Lambeth 24.III.1767 Miniaturist and enamellist. He was the son of a goldsmith, and initially pursued this path, turning later to painting. From 1706 he was based in London, where he worked with the enamellist Charles Boit. Among his pupils was Jeremiah Meyer (*q.v.*). Hoare made a drawing of Zincke at work in 1752 (British Museum). It is not clear why two still lifes, said to be in pastel, have been attributed to him.
