St. Gallen 15.IV.1734 – Leipzig 26.V.1816
Draughtsman and engraver; pupil of Aberli in
Bern from 1757, he followed him to Paris in
1759 where he also worked with Wille. He
became professor of engraving at the Akademie
in Dresden, and was close to Rode,
Chodowiecki and Graff. He was a member of
the Vienna Akademie from 1769 and of that of
Berlin from 1787. The sitter's friend August
Hennings accompanied Mendelssohn to the
studio and described the pastel as "very clearly
drawn".
