Colonel Richard Dawkins (–1705) of Clarendon, Jamaica, member of the Assembly ∞ 1° 1681 Susanna Halstead, née N (–1692); 2° 1693 Elizabeth Masters, née N (–1702)

⇒ William Dawkins (1726–1752sp), member of the assembly for Portland 1749 ∞ 1749 Eleanor Angelina Yeamans (1731–1756) [∞ 2° 1754 Edward Morant (1730–1791) of Brockenhurst, MP {*Reynolds*} *q.v.* [∞ 2° 1762 Mary Goddard {*Reynolds*}]]

⇒ Henry Dawkins (1727–1814), of Jamaica, later of Arlington Street, London, Over Norton, Oxfordshire, and Standlynch, Wiltshire, MP 1760–84 for Southampton, Hindon and Chippenham, elected member of Society of Dilettanti 1759, replacing deceased brother {*Brompton; La Tour; Reynolds*} ∞ 1759 Lady Juliana Colyear (1735–1821) {*Brompton; Read; Reynolds*} *q.v.*

⇒ James Colyear Dawkins (15.ix.1760–1843), MP; took name of Colyear 1835 {*Brompton; Hamilton; Read*} ∞ 1° 1785 Hannah Phipps, widow of Charles Long; 2° Maria Forbes

⇒ George Augustus Colyear-Dawkins (1791–1821sp) 1° ∞ Elizabeth Cooper (–1863) [∞ 2° 1835 Edward Henry Dawkins, *v. infra*]

⇒ Caroline Anna (–1857sa)

⇒ N dau. (6.x.1761–d.inf.)

⇒ Elizabeth (1.i.1763–1831) {*Brompton*} ∞ 1795 William Rookes Leeds Serjeantson (1766–1840) of Camphill

⇒ George Hay Dawkins-Pennant (.ii.1764–1840) of Penrhyn Castle {*Brompton*} ∞ 1° 1807 Sophia Maria Maude (–1812); 2° 1814 Elizabeth Bouverie

⇒ Juliana (–1842) ∞ 1833 1st Baron Penrhyn (–1886)

⇒ Emma (–1888) ∞ 1831 Thomas Charles Hanbury-Tracy, 2nd Lord Sudeley (–1863)

⇒ Henry Dawkins (1765–1852), MP {*Brompton*} ∞ 1788 Augusta Clinton, dau. of General Sir Henry Clinton

⇒ Henry Dawkins (1788–1864), colonel, Coldstream Guards ∞ 1821 Emma Duncombe (–1864)

⇒ Rev. Edward Henry Dawkins (1794–1859), of Morhanger or Moggerhanger House, Bedfordshire; fellow of All Souls, vicar of West Markham, Nottinghamshire, 1828 2° ∞ 1835 Elizabeth Cooper (–1863) [∞ 1° George Augustus Colyear-Dawkins, *v. supra*]

⇒ Edward Henry Frederick Dawkins (1837–1912)
