DAWKINS

Henry Dawkins (1698–1744), sugar planter in Jamaica ∞ Elizabeth Pennant, dau. of Edward Pennant of Jamaica

⇒ James Dawkins (1722–1757sa), MP, archaeologist {*Carriera*}

⇒ Henry Dawkins (1728–1814), of Jamaica, later of Over Norton, Oxfordshire, and Standlynch, Wiltshire, MP for Southampton, elected member of Society of Dilettanti 1759, replacing deceased brother {*La Tour; Reynolds*} ∞ 1759 Lady Juliana Colyear (1735–1821) {*Read; Reynolds*} *q.v.*

⇒⇒ James Colyear Dawkins (1760–1843), MP; took name of Colyear 1835 {*Hamilton; Read*} ∞ 1^o 1785 Hannah Phipps, widow of Charles Long; 2^o Maria Forbes

⇒⇒ George Hay Dawkins-Pennant (c.1764–1840) of Penrhyn Castle ∞ 1^o 1807 Sophia Maria Maude (–1812); 2^o 1814 Elizabeth Bouverie

⇒⇒ Henry Dawkins, MP ∞ Augusta Clinton, dau. of General Sir Henry Clinton

⇒⇒⇒ Henry Dawkins (1788–1864), colonel, Coldstream Guards

⇒⇒⇒ Rev. Edward Henry Dawkins (1794–1859), of Morhanger House, Bedfordshire; fellow of All Souls, vicar of West Markham, Nottinghamshire, 1828 ∞ 1835 Elizabeth Cooper

⇒⇒⇒ Edward Henry Frederick Dawkins (1837–1912)

⇒⇒ Charles Dawkins (1772–1799), of the Grenadier Guards {*Read; Russell*}

⇒⇒ John Dawkins (–1844), fellow of All Souls
